

Message from Jeff Platzer, President:



From Dave Opel- Announcement in Hemmings News June 2023:

Dodge to offer a limited number of buyers the chance to purchase a 2023 Challenger SRT Demon 170. The supercharged 6.2 Hemi produces 1,025 horsepower at 6,500 rpm and 945 ft-lbs of torque at 4,200 rpm. This car can hit 60 mph in 1.66 seconds and cover ¼ mile in 8.91 seconds at 151.17 mph (can we say FAST).

Production will be limited to 3,300 units, 3000 U.S. and 300 Canada. Suggested MSRP to be \$96,666 excluding destination charges and fees. This car is the seventh and final "Last Call" for special edition model for Dodge before phasing out internal combustion performance cars altogether. Sorry to see this end for a very special car.

I'll preface this story by saying I pulled a 1968 Plymouth Road Runner from a barn lot in North Salem, Indiana in 1982 which I still own today. An original 426 Hemi automatic car, I learned from the owner that it came from the Danville Chrysler- Plymouth dealership in Danville Indiana when new. I later met with the dealership owner, Gary Houser in the mid '80s to see if I could learn some history on the car and on him procurring a Hemi back in the day. I have had a valued friendship with Gary ever since. This led to my interest in writing a story on his starting this dealership and some insight to what it was like back in the 'good ole days' of the performance cars era & beyond. Because of its' length, I'll break this down into two parts with the remainder of the story next month. *Tom Kelly*

Let's Make It Danville... PART ONE

Growing up in New Castle Indiana, a lot of local young men marched into the employment office at the New Castle Chrysler Plant with hopes of employment and kick starting their journey towards the American dream. Gary Houser (now Sr.) was among them. Gary hoped he had a leg up on some of the others. He did chores and yardwork for a neighbor lady that worked in the Plant office and crossed his fingers that would help. Alas, things did not work out at Chrysler; at least not yet. Instead, Gary found himself, at age 21, selling cars at the New Castle Ford dealership, Bill Bruce Ford. He found it was a business field that he enjoyed. And it was here that Gary met another salesman, 10 years his senior, who would eventually help set a different trajectory for both of their lives.

After two years at Bill Bruce Ford, Gary now age 23 had a little brainstorming discussion with his friend Bob Huse. They questioned why they were spending such long hours working for someone else when it seemed more reasonable to pursue working for themselves. They decided to investigate starting their own automobile dealership. Gary said they set their sights on a Chrysler Corporation dealership, not even considering Ford or GM.

It was early 1967 and after reviewing their individual savings, they headed out to Cincinnati Ohio, the area's Zone Office for Chrysler Corporation. They walked in, not really knowing anyone and boldly said they had \$16,000 (\$14,000 was Bob's and the youngster Gary had a hard earned \$2000) and wanted to start a Chrysler dealership!

I'm pretty sure today they would have been quickly shown the door, if not actually escorted out by security. Let's remember the world was a little different place some 55 years ago for such a crazy request. Well, the man behind the Chrysler Zone Office desk listened and actually let them give their best sales pitch (they had been selling cars for a few years by now!). He obviously saw their sincerity and desire so stated Chrysler's requirements. It basically boiled down to, 'you get a facility leased from the list of areas where we want a dealership, and we'll give you a Chrysler-Plymouth

franchise'! I suspect they might have thought, "wow, we should have done this years ago!". Among the numerous Indiana location choices were Elwood, Madison, and Danville. He then added that there was an abandoned Pontiac dealership building and lot in Danville that was currently on the market. Ok, they agreed, let's try Danville!

Armed with that lead and an abundance of youthful determination, they identified the former dealership facility and found the location just east of Danville on old US 36. They discovered it had been a Pontiac dealership for many years, first under Nort Watson, who later relocated his dealership to Indianapolis. The facility was then reopened as Jake Freedman Pontiac. This owner later vacated it for his new site a bit further east, in the building that currently houses 'The Finer Details' restoration shop in Danville.

After contacting the site owner, the man said he wanted \$500 a month to lease the building and lot. Gary said, 'we countered with \$450 a month and the gentleman said he'd take that for the first year of the lease'. The first step was done, and they were on their way towards the birth of Danville Chrysler-Plymouth (C-P). As an aside, Gary told me that there had been a Dodge dealership in the Danville town limits up until 1961 but it had closed when they saw the 1961 Dodge models! I had heard about the dealership outcry ("we can't sell those!") when the homely (or some said 'ugly') 1961 Chrysler product models were introduced to the public. This appears to be firsthand confirmation!

After locking in the facility and getting confirmation of their new C-P franchise, the partners had to get busy immediately. New 1968 model release was mid-September in those days, and it was approaching quickly. There was a lot of work required to get established and geared up. Gary got a room at the Kirk Motel (it was located across Old US 36 from the current Finer Details location at that time). It obviously wasn't practical to commute 80 miles each way from his home in New Castle daily. The partner's leased building was completely empty, so some frantic shopping ensued. Consider that they were starting from scratch. Desks, chairs, file cabinets, supplies, etc., all had to be located, ordered, and purchased. They hauled furniture and equipment with a 1958 Dodge truck they had purchased from the New Castle Ford dealership before they left. An old Mopar truck... what a great way to start a Chrysler dealership!

Another priority was finding a mechanic to take care of vehicle prep and service. They were starting from the ground up, not taking over an existing business so lots of things had to be considered. The garage mechanic would require tools, engine diagnostic equipment and obviously all the other equipment to adequately service and repair the new and used vehicles they would be selling.

Gary first approached Slim Davisson, a mechanic at the Kincaid Chrysler Dealership in nearby Lizton, but after much deliberation, said he couldn't risk leaving his stable job for a start-up. Interestingly enough, the Lizton dealership closed years before Danville C-P finally did! Gary eventually hired Jim Willard who worked for him for many years. Gary said initially he and Bob were pretty much 'jacks of all trades' for the first few years though each had their specialized tasks. Bob handled a lot of the office paperwork duties & parts, while Gary handled sales. Gary noted that Ms. Blanche Wean was a wonderful help as she did some of their legal bookkeeping and knew everyone in town, which helped immensely being new to the area. Gary said this small staff did have a business advantage with low overhead, but the workload did keep them extremely busy those first few years!

As their business continued to grow, a year after opening, they hired Jim Pitcock as their second mechanic. Gary said Jim was a wizard on the Sun distributor and engine diagnostic machines in the shop. Gary also remembered the initial shop rate was \$5.50/hour for service/repair. Yeah, the good old days!

Gary remembered the original location had a showroom that would only hold 3 cars but did have an adequate service area. That initial location's building & lot, though now significantly changed, still exists today as Edwards Equipment Sales, a Kubota tractor and Stihl equipment dealer on Old US 36, across from the Danville Hendricks County Hospital complex.

Their new Danville Chrysler-Plymouth dealership officially opened the day after Labor Day, September 5, 1967, just ahead of new model introductions. There was just one glitch, albeit a rather large one! Though they had ramped up

with used cars, over a month after opening, in mid-October, they still had no new 1968 models to display in their new car showroom! Anyone who grew up in the late '60s & early '70 muscle car era (including me), remembers how exciting it was to head to the dealership and get a first look at the new year's offering. 1968 was especially exciting as the new Road Runner and remodeled GTXs were being introduced. You may have seen advance pictures, advertisements or even teaser road tests in the car magazines. You might have even seen ads in the "LIFE" or "LOOK" magazines that your mom received, but it was nothing like seeing them 'in the flesh' at the dealership. Yet Gary and Bob had no new cars to display!

Gary made some frantic calls to the Cincinnati Zone Office to see what had happened to their first allocation of new vehicles. It was finally discovered that due to a clerical mix-up, their Line of Credit had not been activated. Their new 1968 model vehicles were still at the factory's holding facility in Detroit. They were told the new cars would not arrive any time soon, so alternative measures had to be taken. A quick call to Charlie Taylor, the owner of Hoosier Chrysler Plymouth dealership (Lafayette Road, just south of 38th Street, Indianapolis) resulted in the loan of three new cars for their showroom! Gary remembered having three 1968 Plymouth Satellites: a blue 2 door, a maroon 2 door with black vinyl top and a blue 4 door! The new Danville Chrysler-Plymouth Dealership, Code 64123, was finally in the new car business! (PART 2 NEXT MONTH)


