Message from Jeff Platzer, Club President:



At a time like this, you realize what a great group of people we have in the Indy Mopar Club! THANK YOU!












From Tom Kelly -

Let's Make It Danville (CHRYSLER-PLYMOUTH-DODGE) ... PART TWO of THREE

(Due to other submissions this month, this article was broken into THREE parts).

Gary Houser Sr. remembered it was tough going for the first number of years. As with many small towns even today, the business had a little trouble being accepted in the community since they were 'outsiders'. He said the Danville area had a lot of folks who worked for GM and Detroit Diesel-Allison so gaining a customer base for Chrysler Products was a challenge. It helped that he had used cars of all different manufacturers to get potential customers on the lot. Gary remembered his first used car on the lot was a maroon 1955 Ford with spinner hubcaps, certainly something to grab attention! He said he always had a personal preference for the 66-67 Chrysler products body lines.

Interestingly, Gary said though he struggled getting 'GM loyal' dad & mom to stop in the showroom, the new '68 Plymouth GTX and Road Runners did draw in the younger crowd! He credited the Mopar muscle cars with attracting a lot of initial interest, traffic, and young customers to their brand-new dealership. A later review of some of his old sales files confirmed a lot of GTXs found new owners from his dealership. Gary estimated that about 1/3 of his new car sales were performance cars during the start-up years. He attributes that to helping them survive those critical first few years!

Regarding new vehicle selection for the dealership, I asked if Chrysler Corporate influenced what specific type of models he stocked. I was curious if they pushed the high-performance vehicles at all. Gary didn't remember any specific emphasis on the performance cars, but the Michigan area Chrysler Sales Bank did let him know what they had available and make recommendations. Other sources of stock were Chrysler Exec cars that were Dealer Auctioned at various plants in Detroit. He would get calls from the Chrysler rep regularly, letting him know current available stock.

Interesting to me, this is how he obtained the specific car I later pulled from a field in late 1982. More on this later but here is the teaser: The Chrysler factory rep called Gary and said they had two 1968 Hemi Road Runners available if he was interested. One was a PP1 Matador Red, Hemi Automatic Coupe (the one I own today) and the other was a GG1 Forest Green Hemi Automatic. Gary said, "I'll take them both" and they became the only two Hemi cars he ever sold through the dealership. As I noted, plenty of other performance cars were sold through Danville, including three 1969-1/2 A12 lift-off hood cars (one Six Pack Super Bee and two 440-6BBL Road Runners) and at least one AAR Cuda. 340 and 383 cars were popular sales as well for Danville. He even sold a few 'Lil Red Express trucks new in their '78-'79 era.

There was one performance car Gary remembered with a bit of distaste after all these years. He said he acquired a 340 Dart GTS exec car. Gary said unfortunately, it was light blue, had a white vinyl top with a white interior. While this car would likely be quite popular today in the collector market, we suspect back then it was not quite 'macho' enough with that color scheme. Gary said he had to practically 'give it away' to get it off his lot!

Gary smiled as he recalled another sale he was working on. This one was a Plum Crazy Dodge Dart. The Buyer wanted a black Racing Stripes on the hood so Gary said they could take care of it to make the sale. They took it into the shop, scuffed the area and painted the stripes with black spray cans as they had no paint gun equipment. The shop must have done an outstanding job since the owner was happy and the sale was completed!

Gary also remembered one particularly nightmarish event when he drove into the lot early one morning and found four new Road Runners sitting on concrete blocks with their wheels & tires missing. Definitely not a good way to start off the day!

During our conversation, an interesting aside for me was remembering a small used car lot just west of Brownsburg on US 136. I had gotten my license in early 1968 and my buddies and I would include this car lot in our after-hours cruise route to see what new Mopar cars they had on the lot. I found it curious that Porter's Used Cars always had an

abundance of Dodge and Plymouth muscle cars that were nearly always current model years. I always wondered how this tiny used car lot managed to get an abundance of highly desirable late model Mopar factory 'hot-rods'. Gary was able to shed light on this mystery as well. Gary knew the owner, Bill Porter, and said Bill was a licensed auto auctioneer. Bill happened to have a contract with Chrysler Corporation to oversee the Chrysler Exec car auctions for the Lynch Road Assembly Plant. These on-site auctions were for dealers looking to acquire low mileage Exec cars. Bill Porter obviously knew what was coming across the block and managed to acquire a few of the more desirable Road Runners, Super Bees, Chargers, GTXs and R/Ts for himself. As today, being in the right place at the right time was a nice advantage. Gary smiled as he recalled those many trips to the Detroit auctions with other area dealers who became great friends and great buddies to party with!

Among many of the other dealership owners at the time, Gary noted that Charlie Taylor (Hoosier Chrysler Plymouth), Eldon Palmer (Palmer Dodge) and John Jackson (C-P in Muncie, now Gaddis) were great friends to travel and hang with.

When I met Gary in the mid '80s after buying my Road Runner, I knew he also sold new Dodges along with Chryslers and Plymouths. Most of the Indianapolis area dealerships were either C-P or Dodge but not both, so I asked him how that transpired. Gary said Chrysler offered the Dodge franchise to them in spring or summer 1968 at no additional initial investment so they jumped on that opportunity. It may have been based on Danville being a rural dealership and the fact Chrysler had lost the Dodge dealership in the area in 1961 as mentioned earlier. Regardless, it allowed Danville C-P-D to sell new Dodge trucks to the area farmers as well as school buses to the local school corporations. He later actually sold a Dodge dump truck to the Town of Danville, taking a 1955 Chevy dump truck in trade. The dealership had finally become accepted by the community!


Gary personally served the Danville community as well, after locating in Danville. He joined the Danville Fire Department in 1969 and became the Assistant Fire Chief in January 1975. Gary served with the Department through 1980. The Danville dealership also sponsored local Little League as well as local bowling leagues through the years. The dealership advertised in the Hendricks County Flyer and on a local Public Service radio station.

Since Gary and Bob were leasing the initial property, the partners decided to buy a piece of property a mile or so east of their first site in the fall of 1968 at US 36 and County Road 300 East. They eventually built and relocated the dealership to that location in February 1972.

In 1980, Gary bought out Bob Huse's share of the Danville C-P dealership and continued the business on his own. As Gary continued to grow his Chrysler-Plymouth-Dodge dealership, Bob Huse returned to Ford Motor Company.


We spoke of sales promotions during the early years. Gary said tent sales were a tactic used to bring customers out, much as still used today. The local dealerships often held a combined Hendricks County Dealers tent sale at US 36 & State Road 267 (it was mainly open fields back then but it's a main crossroad of Avon today). Along with Danville C-P-D, Gary remembers Tom Costin Buick (Plainfield), Joe Stevens C-P (Plainfield), Blank Chevrolet (Brownsburg), Carson Ford (Brownsburg), Dugan Chevrolet (Danville) and all the other Hendricks County dealerships participating at the time.

During our conversation, I gained a little insight into the workings of dealerships & Chrysler's business requirements and practices back in the late '60s-80s. **That will be covered in Part THREE of this article next month.** *TVK*
