
From Dart Liebrandt –

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From Tom Kelly - CONTINUATION: Let's Make It Danville (CHRYSLER-PLYMOUTH-DODGE) ... PART 3 OF 3

From conversation with Gary, I gained a little insight into the workings of dealerships & Chrysler's business requirements and practices back in the late '60s through the '80s:

- The dealership's advertising budget with Chrysler was based on the number of vehicles sold on an annual basis.
- Chrysler's Corporate Sales training and communication was weak per Gary's experience having worked for Ford initially. Ford had much stronger dealership support programs.
- From about 1969-1990, if a car was sold through Chrysler Credit and the purchaser defaulted on the loan, the Dealership was responsible to purchase the vehicle back from Chrysler Credit. Gary actually had to go get a car in Florida because of this requirement, purchasing his one-way airfare on his AmEx card!
- Chrysler also established sales targets for the dealerships during the '80s "K-Car" era. If you achieved your target, you got a discount on your vehicle purchases. Gary said his dealership sales volume did so well that some other area dealerships (including Rockville, Greencastle, Rushville, Connersville, and Martinsville) would purchase their stock from him because he'd sell the vehicles cheaper to them than they could buy directly from the factory. Gary was very proud of that success.
- The New Model Release Reveals were held in Las Vegas for many years. It was quite an extravaganza and a great time. As a side note, my wife is a professional singer and worked on Detroit Manufacturer's Reveals music & soundtracks during that timeframe. Gary noted that Lee Iacocca ended Chrysler's participation after their bankruptcy issues in about 1985 for a few years until Chrysler paid back their government Ioan in '83. They celebrated in style with the huge new model reveal/extravaganza that included Mr. Iacocca, Frank Sinatra, music celebrities, and politicians.
- Chrysler Finance & Insurance (F&I) was a profit center for dealerships with 0.5% additional income to the dealership based on the amount financed through them.
- Gary was not a fan of the Chrysler re-badged imports. He said, "if you wanted one, you couldn't get it, and if you had one you couldn't sell it." During the gas crunch, he had a globe-type gas pump painted on the showroom window with "The American Way to Beat the Pump" and pushed the non-V8 domestic built Chrysler Products.
- Gary Sr. had a great memory of touring the Cummins Columbus facility as a guest of Dodge Truck in 1992 and was able to bring his dad. This was likely the celebration of Dodge having the Pace Car that year. The tour included a Dodge truck convoy let by a Stealth that was escorted north from Columbus to Indy, around I-465 to Speedway and then around the Indianapolis 500 Track. The event included a wonderful meal and displays and was very special to all the group attending.

After a long and successful career as a Chrysler-Plymouth-Dodge dealership owner, Gary Sr. made the decision to retire from the business the 1st day of November (day after Halloween he said) 1993. The dealership was sold to his son Gary Jr. and two partners.

The dealership had a new dealership built and relocated around 2006 in alignment with Daimler-Chrysler's directive for the new 'Taj Mahal' dealership buildings. This third location was on new US 36 just west of Avon, IN at the Prestwick Addition. Unfortunately, the business did not survive the poor economy of the late 2000s and finally closed the doors. After a brief inglorious period as a foreign car dealership, the building is currently an Electrical Contractor facility.

As a closing footnote, Gary Sr. has great memories from his years in the business and says he has been blessed over these years. His youngest son Jeff is still in the auto business in Naples Florida. Gary Sr. has a daughter Tammy and his oldest son Gary Jr.

Gary Sr. still has a collection of Chrysler vehicles including a 1978 'Lil Red Express and a 1982 Dodge Mirada he sold new and later kept when taken back in trade at his dealership years later. He just recently sold a 1974 Plymouth 'Cuda he also took in trade many years ago. It seems Mopar blood runs deep in the family since Gary Sr.'s sister, having just retired from St. Vincent's Children's care, is currently having a Hellcat engine transplanted into her 1974 Dodge Challenger!

In closing this story, remember the pair of 1968 Hemi Road Runners Gary sold in early 1968? The green one ended up going to a gentleman in Paris, Illinois per Gary's old dealership file. A search of the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) on the internet has unfortunately turned up no current info as to whether it still exists or not.

And what about the second Hemi car, the Matador Red 1968 Road Runner Coupe? Per original dealership file documents. it was invoiced to Danville C-P on February 5, 1968, and Automobile Shippers Incorporated's transporter delivered it to Danville on February 9. Just under a month later, a gentleman from Brownsburg Indiana purchased the car on March 4, 1968. The Window Sticker was \$3881.35 and he had a trade-in allowance of \$681.36 to offset the cost.

The original owner only kept the Road Runner for a little over two months before selling it for reasons unknown. The second owner was a farmer, now deceased, from North Salem, Indiana and he bought this nearly new car on May 17, 1968. The car had a most successful street racing history according to the many people I've since talked to who knew of its exploits. After six years of pretty hard use, the red Hemi Road Runner was then parked in the owner's brother's barn lot in 1974, its actual malady long forgotten. Though courted for years to sell it, the owner chose not to part with it.

I heard about the car through a mutual friend in early September 1982. After much discussion over the phone on 'my intentions' for the car, I received the owner's approval to buy it. While others primarily wanted the engine for their projects, I stated from the onset that I planned to restore the Road Runner back to its original factory condition. That was the answer he had been looking for all those years!

I purchased the Road Runner on September 21,1982. My brother and a friend helped me winched it onto a trailer, hit a car wash with \$5 worth of quarters then trailered it to its new home. With the original 426 Hemi engine and transmission still in place, five years of labor and quite a few dollars later, it was broken in on North State Road 39 in front of my house in 1987. It's first outing that same week was the '87 Muscle Car Drag Race in Quaker City, Ohio. I've subsequently participated in numerous pure stock drag racing events, the most recently the Pure Stock Muscle Car Drag Race (PSMCDR) in Stanton Michigan off and on through 2015. I finally retired it from racing because of the value it still retaining its original engine and transmission. This 1968 Road Runner still sits in my garage today, now going on 41 years of my ownership.

I originally met Gary in the mid-1980s after buying the car. Having learned it came from Danville C-P, I met Gary Sr., and he was kind enough to look into his old files to see if he had information on it. We found the file on the green Hemi car but not the file on the red Road Runner I now owned.

Fast forward to approximately the year 2000 or so. Gary Sr. presented me with copies of the original paperwork and even the Certicard for my car. He had come across the folder in his old dealership files and made sure I received them. I cannot thank Gary Sr. enough for that kind gesture. I honestly believe he loves my old Road Runner almost as much as I do!

I dedicate this story to Gary Sr. He originally brought my Road Runner to Danville Indiana and thanks to that, I have it today. He's made another friend for life.






Deb helping with Trailer #2
